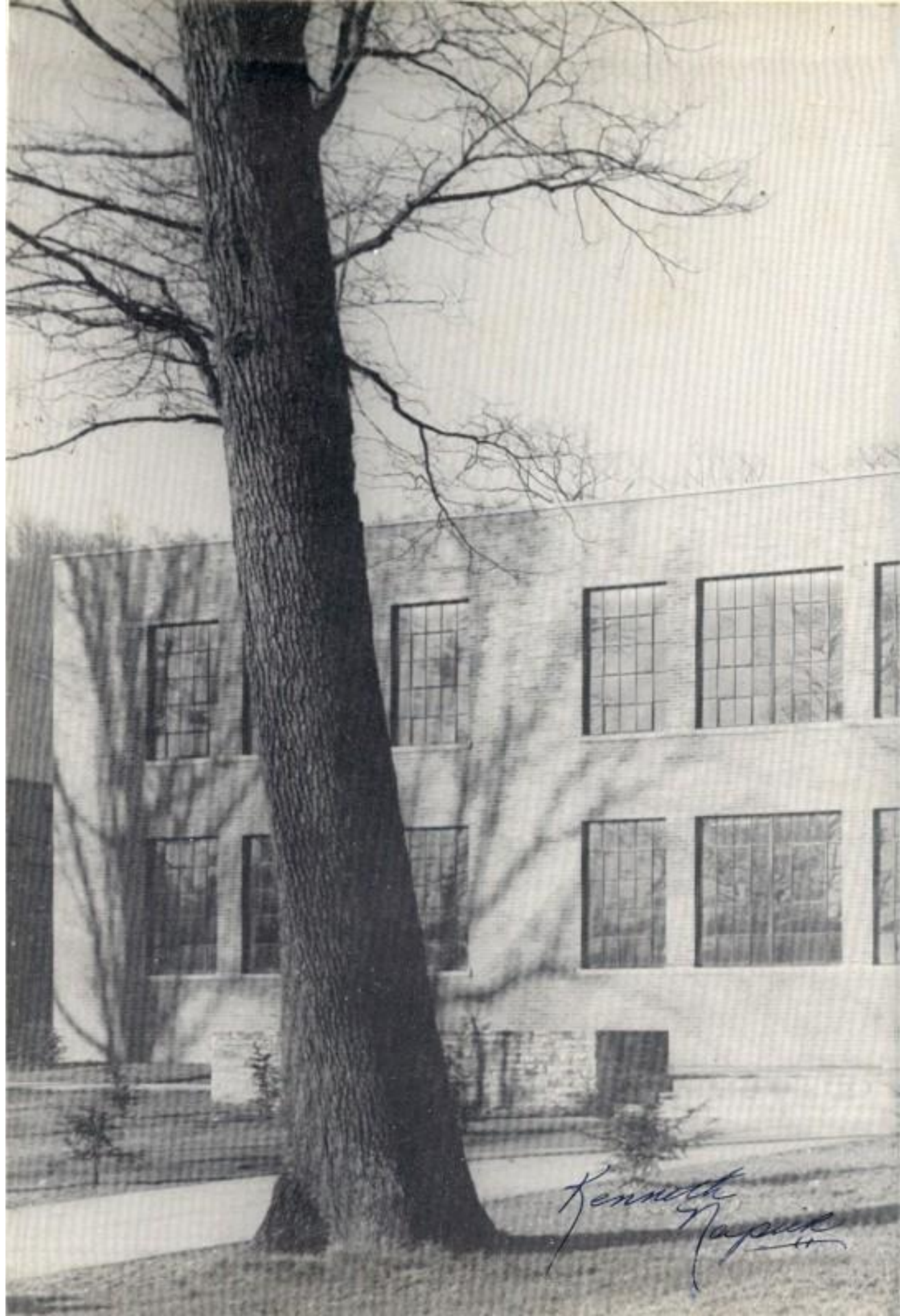

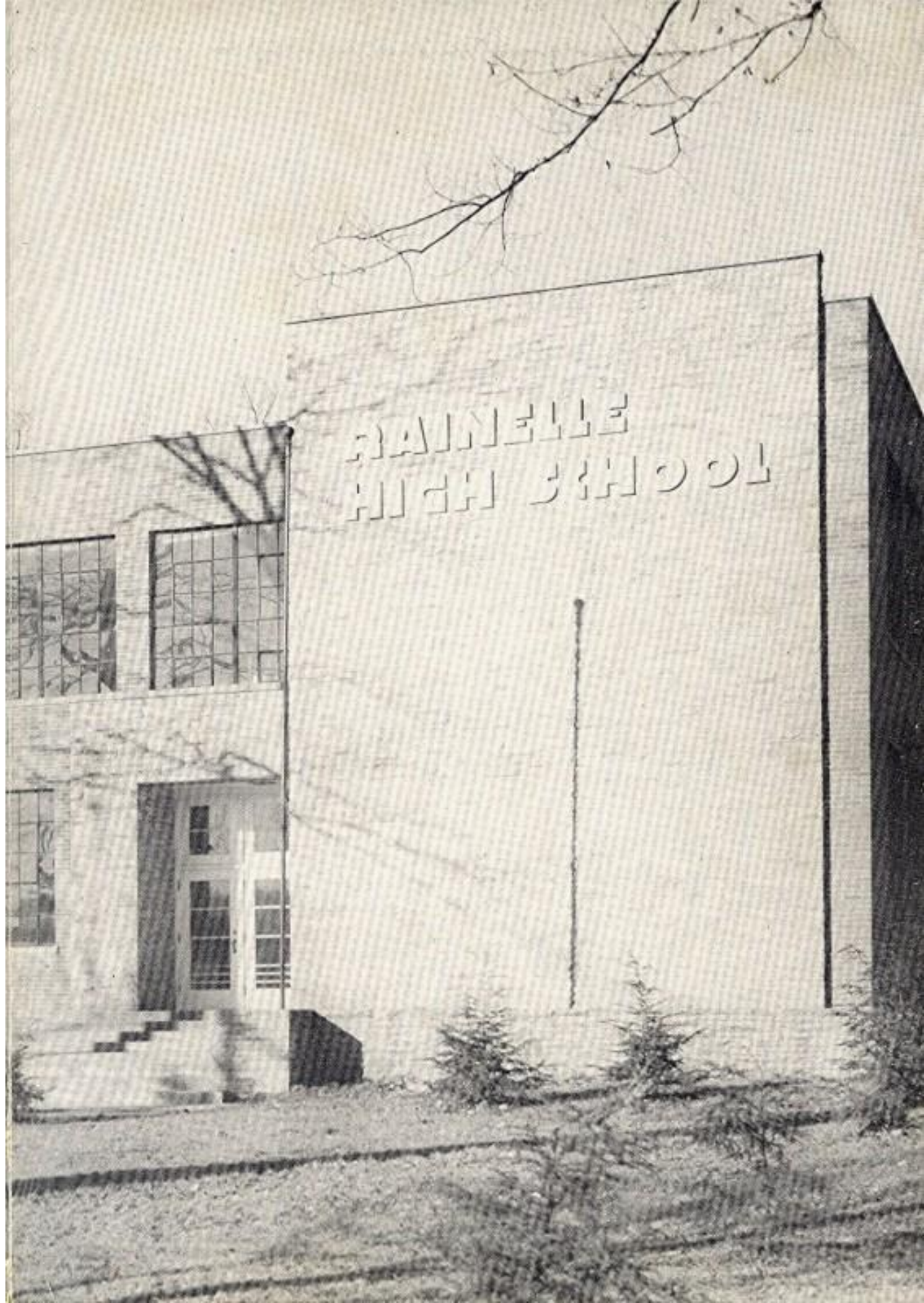

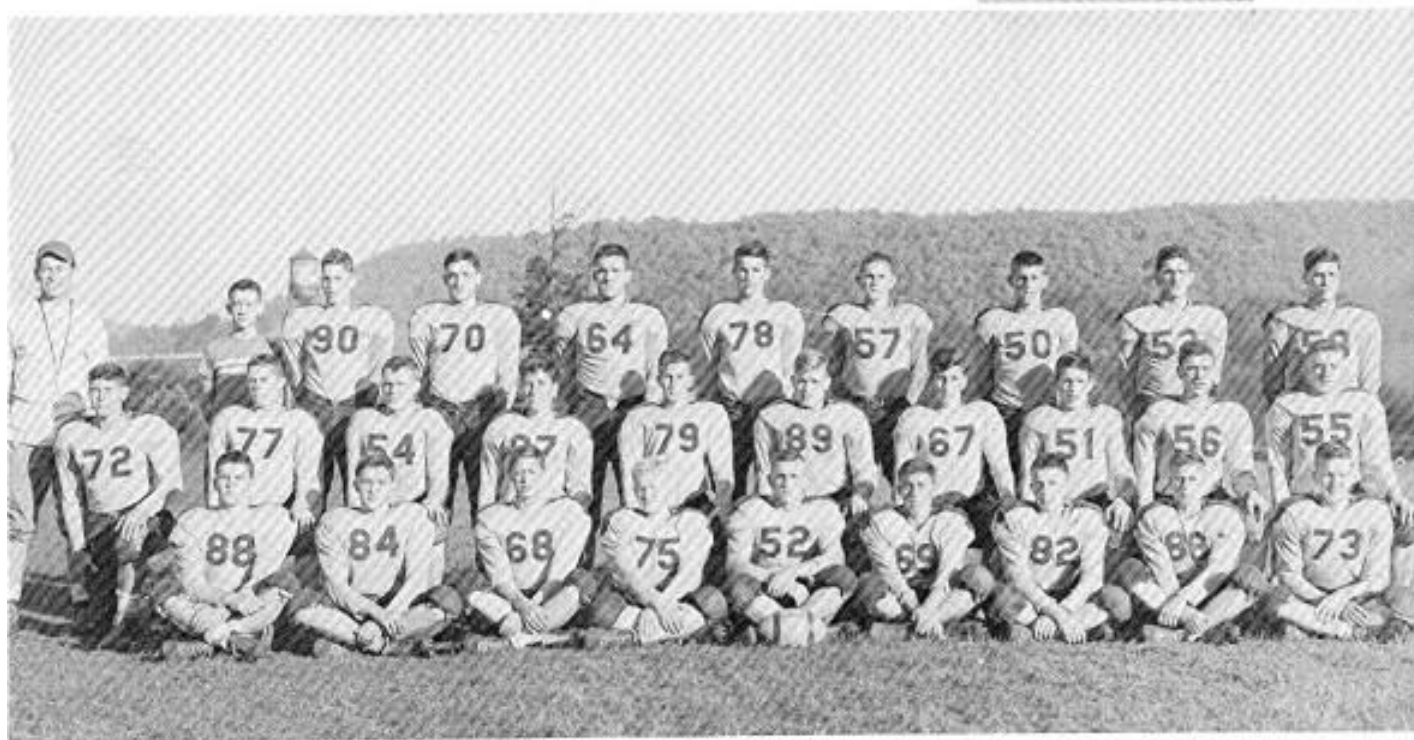
As you go, select the everlasting and enjoyable moments from the classrooms and activities that made 1951-52.

The largest score of the season was run up against Ronceverte as Partain, Lively, and Skidmore each crossed the chalk stripes for two scores. Frank Surbaugh and Melvin Sanford added the two other counters, Surbaugh on quarterback sneak and Sanford ran a blocked punt across for a TD.

RUPERT

Rupert slowed the Ranger attack down the first half, holding Rainelle to a lone score the first two periods. However, the locals started rolling in the third quarter and proceeded to trounce the Crimson Tide, 26-7.

CRICHTON

Rainelle furnished the entire show for the homecoming game as the Rangers started a drive on the opening kickoff and were never headed. Led by Surbaugh's quarterbacking ability and running, Rainelle pounded out a 47-0 victory over the Crichton Wildcats.

ANSTED

Rainelle took advantage of breaks and played an aggressive game throughout the contest as they trampled Ansted, 46-0. Skidmore and Surbaugh led the Ranger's offensive attack, running and passing Rainelle to victory number eight.

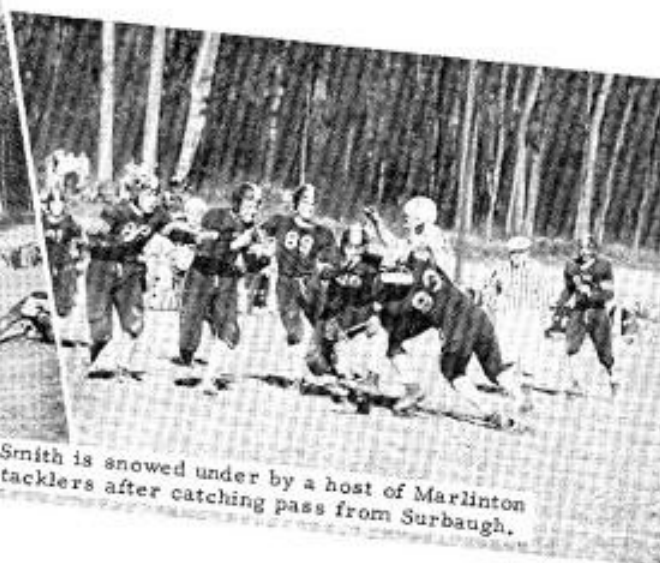

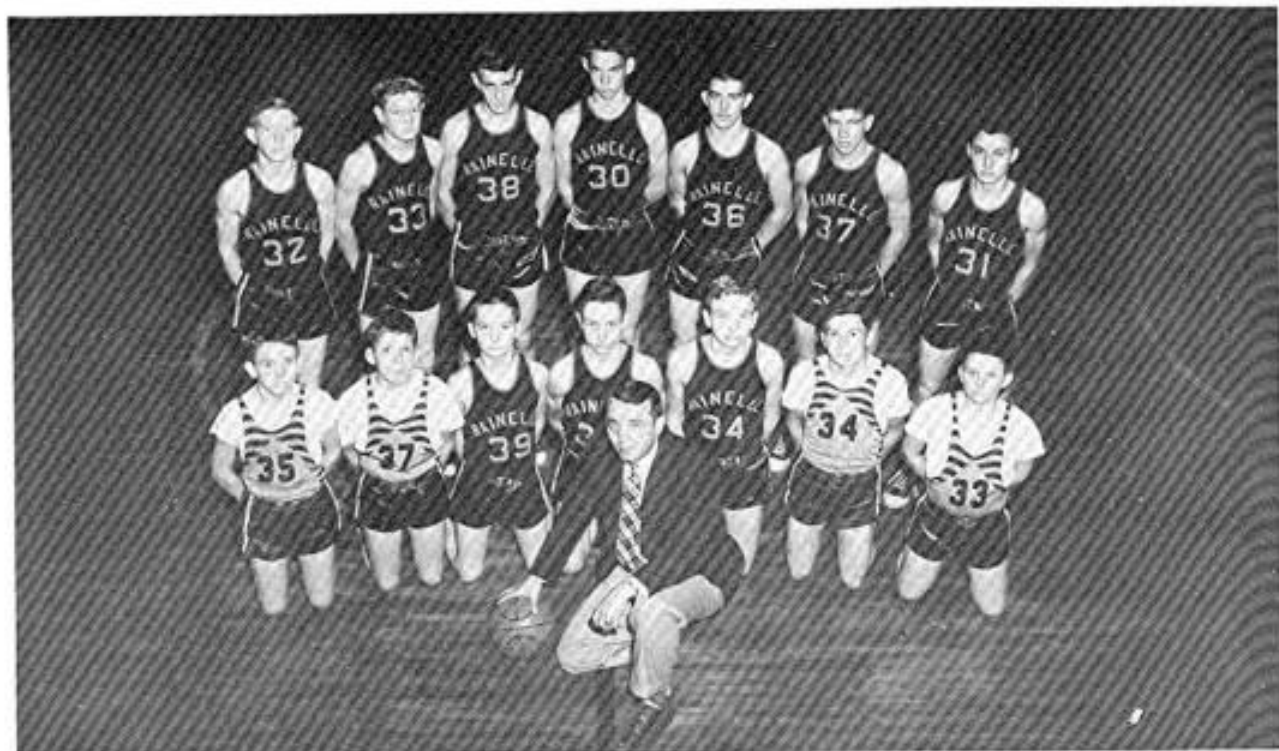
