





It would be impossible to say how many times we have all been encouraged and helped by the ability and outgoing friendliness of our beloved principal, Mr. Dale Ocheltree.



Our years in high school and our future in all fields of life are influenced by our friend and principal, Mr. Ocheltree.














HOMECOMING
