
Foreword

The YMCA's youth and Government Program is a teen-age activity which has prestige and status in the eyes of youth. It is an educational training experience in state government which began in 1936. High school Hi-Y and Tri-Hi-Y members are deeply involved in the process of determining areas of community need and developing those appropriate for legislation at the state level into the forms of a bill or resolution. Prepared at prelegislative training conferences for their share in the legislative experience, the young people elect their own state officials and cumulate their year's work with two to three days at Youth Legislatures meetings in the legislative chambers of the state capitol. Their earnest, skilled efforts as youth senators, representatives or elected officials, thrill observers in committee and legislative sessions where bills are debated and acted upon.

A number of bills originally proposed and passed by Youth Legislators have subsequently been introduced and enacted into law by the adult legislatures.
