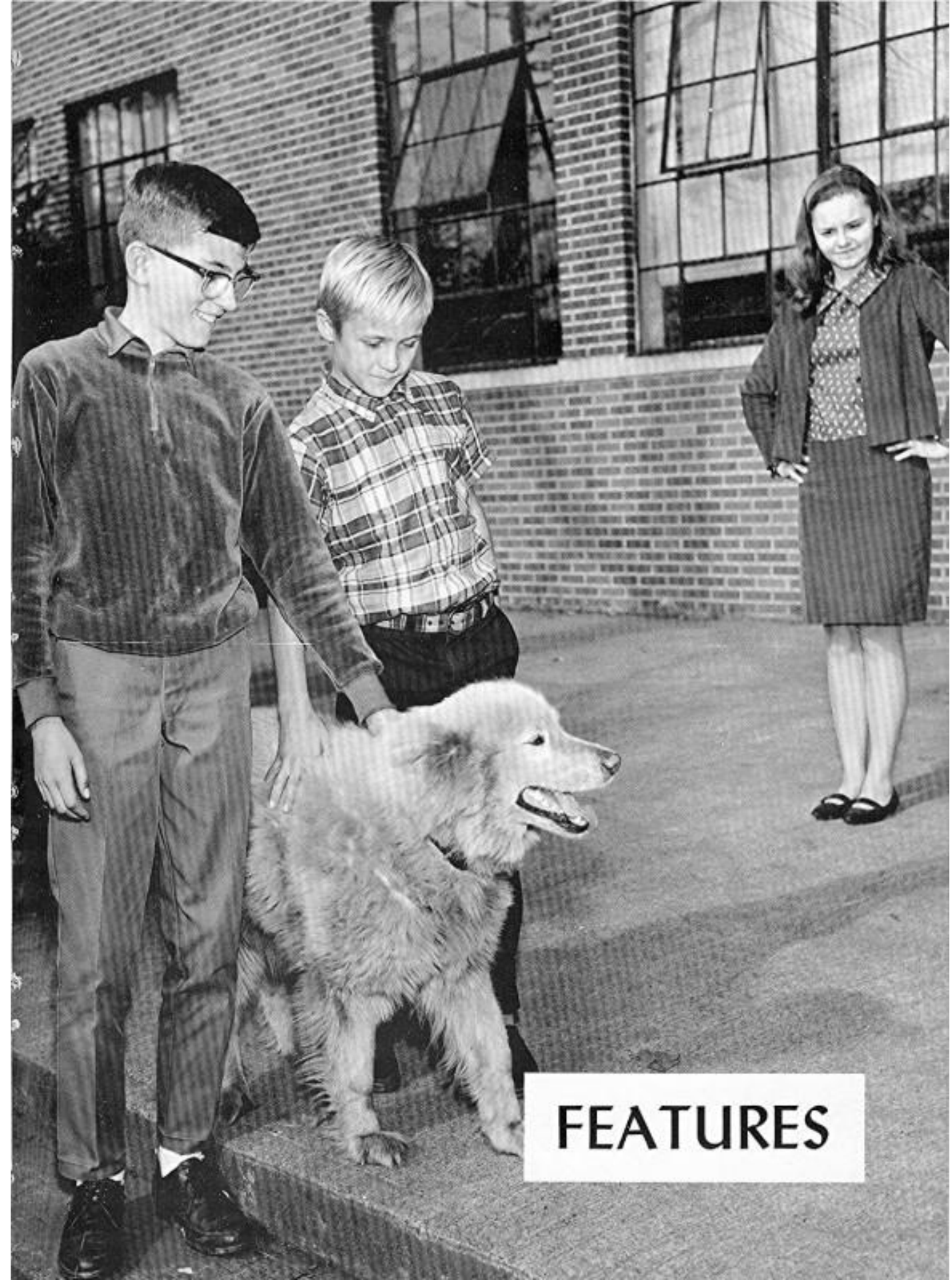

"I CALL FOR THE PREVIOUS QUESTION!"

Each year this call rings out in the legislative chambers of the state capitol. It is the voice of teenagers in West Virginia demanding that the bill under debate be voted upon. It comes from the finest seedbed for leadership—the YMCA's Youth in Government Program.



The three days in the state's capitol were thrilling, stirring, memorable, and the greatest! Yet these three days were only the capping climax in one of the YMCA's leadership programs for youth.

Each year Greenbrier District teenagers are a part of the YMCA's Model Legislature. It is by no means a once-a-year program, but rather a constant effort to inculcate in every community a richer understanding of the heritage and history of our democratic way of life and to foster in the minds of the young people a greater understanding of how our government functions. Its aim is to develop and sustain moral fortitude and courage in the solution of public problems and to provide helpful preparation for later participation in the policy-determining aspects of the democratic process.

Greenbrier Delegates were well prepared by Delegate Robert Holliday at an all day pre-legislative training program prior to the main event which was actually conducted in the legislative chambers of the state capitol building.
